#### **FINANCIAL HEALTH**

Our Treasurer, David Lewis, reported positive cash flow for the past month, which is great news as we head into the new season. David is also working on the budget for this financial year to ensure we maintain strong financial health after last year's loss due to

the new tender services and the preparation of the DA to repair the wharf.

The Board is considering establishing an Endowment Fund for MYC to secure the club's financial future. This proposal will be voted on in our next meeting, but we will consult with you all before its establishment.

Membership is at the core of our club, and we're preparing to send out this year's membership in the coming days. As always, we encourage our members to introduce new friends and family to the club.



#### **VENUE AND FACILITIES**





fleet started near Flagstaff Point and was sent to Rocky and Edwards a total of 3 times - however, the lack of breeze shortened the course to only 2 laps.



A great fleet turn out with 8 boats from MHYC and It Happens coming up from CYCA to boost the MYC fleet. Mostly these were casual entries, but hopefully we will see them back again for the next Combined Clubs Sunday Series race on 22<sup>nd</sup> September. In the Combined Clubs Sunday Series Law Connect was hard to catch - and no one did crossing the line almost an hour ahead of all comers.


The J24s had some good competition with Ace, and Innaminka giving MYC boat Kaotic, a run

## NOAKES SYDNEY TO SOUTHPORT RACE

27 JULY 2024

#### THE START...

A slow start for this year's Sydney to Southport race with WSW breezes of 5 gusting to 6 knots at the 1pm start gun. The wind didn't improve but some boats, including *Mondo* and *Kanreki* made it out the heads and sought breeze further out to sea. Unfortunately, a bunch of the smaller boats didn't emerge from The Heads



until some 3-4 hours later - so frustrating!

Watching the tracker, it appears that *Mondo* sailed very well in the early stages of the race, keeping in touch with much bigger boats. *Kanreki* was spotting with the other Cookson 12 but lack of visibility (i.e. sat) left them blind as to where their competitors were. *Jupiter* got caught in the second batch of boats to leave the harbour and has been trying to make up ever since.

At time of writing *Mondo* is 168nm from the finish, *Kanreki* is 175.6nm and *Jupiter* is 194.3nm from the finish.

The penultimate race for the Manly Yacht Club winter series. A bright sunny day with a west to west south westerly 10-13 knots occasionally gusting to 16-19, and occasionally below the 10-knot mark. Course 2 was the preferred choice of RO Peter Bennell, which meant we had to lay a mark to replace the 40 baskets AS mark that disappeared, never to be seen again!

In division 1, *Geck* o had a blinder of a race, first across the line and first on handicap followed by *San Toy*, second across the line, second on handicap and back on form with the starters prize - although 5 seconds is nothing to boast about. *Absolut* came in third over the line and on handicap, despite sailing part of the race bareheaded - well done.

Absolut is still in the lead in the series but only 1 point separates them from Gecko in second place - so watch this space!

In division 2, *Kia Kaha* couldn't be seen for dust (or maybe that should be spray). Picking all the right shifts, Kia Kaha steamed over the finish line first and was also first on handicap, with Magician V in second and Esprit de Four in third place.

Not all stories were told on the deck afterwards, but I guess "what happens on the water, stays on the water".

*Kia Kaha* still leads the series, but it's not impossible for *Plum Crazy* to roll them in the last race, or at least hang on to second place from *Fast Company*, only a point behind.

Be on the deck for race 6 to claim the draw from the barrel - 2 nights' accommodation - Altitude "The Lodge - Smiggins". The series winners will receive a coffee hamper from Seven Miles Coffee Roasters.

## **DIVER STILL WANTED!**








The "new" MYC tender, back from her beauty treatment, is looking for someone to keep giving her some TLC.



#### Jupiter Aims for Stellar Performance in Sydney Gold Coast Race

As the Noakes Sydney Gold Coast Yacht Race approaches, the crew of \*Jupiter\*, skippered by Ian Smith and Lincoln Dews, is ready to set sail with high hopes and meticulous preparation. The J99 yacht, a standout in the Double Handed fleet, has been fine-tuned over the winter, positioning itself as a strong contender in this prestigious event.

Reflecting on their journey, Ian Smith shared, "We had a successful summer campaign. It's been an 18-month journey since July last year, putting the boat together to campaign for the Audi Centre Sydney Blue Water Point Score and the Rolex Sydney Hobart Yacht Race this year."

Lincoln Dews, co-skipper, who has been integral to *Jupiter's* preparations, added, "I've been lucky enough to sail with Ian for the past year and being involved ahead of the ACSBWPS the Great Race South at the end of the year. It's a fantastic boat, and we've had a lot of fun learning and optimising it through the winter."

With weather predictions shifting in the lead-up to the race, the team remains adaptable and optimistic. "The forecast has been changing daily for the last three weeks," said Smith. "But it looks like a light start, which favours us. "The lighter, the longer, the better." It's going to be an exhilarating ride up to Southport once the breeze picks up on Sunday morning."



Jupiter will be navigating through a competitive Double Handed fleet, which includes formidable opponents. "The boat to beat and the benchmark is Mistral, Rupert Henry's boat, with Greg O'Shea. They're a very competitive team, and having such a strong benchmark has certainly made us sail better," Smith noted. "We're a better combination now than we were at Cabbage Tree, and the boat is better prepared as well."

Lincoln Dews also emphasized the importance of strategic sailing and adapting to conditions. "We're learning to sail this boat quite well and optimizing it for the IRC with what's crewed. The first day's forecast is quite light, and depending on how the system develops, we're hoping for a blow home for the smaller boats."

Jupiter's crew is not only eyeing a strong finish in the Double Handed division but also aiming for a podium position in Division 3. "All things being equal, we should do well in the Double Handed division, and there's a good chance for a podium position in Division 3," Smith said. "The higher up the podium, the better, as far as I'm concerned."

With a combination of experience, strategic planning, and an indomitable spirit, *Jupiter* is set to navigate the challenges of the Noakes Sydney Gold Coast Yacht Race, aiming for stellar performance and victory.
