2023

WHAT A YEAR IT'S BEEN!

First and foremost, I want to acknowledge the incredible success of our youth sailors at MYC. Evie Saunders continues to dominate on the international laser circuit; all this on top of completing her HSC.





Next we have our graduating Open Skiff sailors; their purchase of *Okavango Delta* and their results in the J70 regatta; the MYC Summer Series and Sydney Women's Keelboat Regatta series. It is a credit to the members at

Manly Yacht Club who have provided them with opportunities to sail on their own yachts; who have coached them and who have supported their transition into yacht sailing. Particularly I want to acknowledge Lyn Humphreys, Arthur Crothers, Stephen Teudt and Catherine Thornton-Rofe.







Michael Rowe, who has been our Vice President for the last four years, is sadly stepping down from the Board. Michael was so

gracious to step into this role at the same time that I became President, and I will be forever grateful for the support, the wisdom and his pragmatism during his time on the Board. Thank you, Michael, for your service and we look forward to seeing yours and Ben's Sail Xchange competing at MYC.

The second half of this year has presented both challenges an opportunity for Manly Yacht Club.

Sometimes you don't appreciate what you have until it's gone, and I feel that perhaps we have taken for granted just exactly how much Bruce and Pam Davis, via Davis Marina, have supported the members, and racing, at Manly Yacht Club over last several decades.





I am proud of our response that in a few short, stressful, weeks we had a plan in place to ensure that every Twilight, Summer Series and Club Championship entrant had access to their yacht; were able to collect crew; and ultimately continue racing at MYC. It's been tricky at times but through the coordination of Stephen Teudt we have used a combination of volunteers and paid staff to ensure that no boat has ever missed a race.

We are finalising plans to introduce a fair fee structure in 2024 to support the ongoing service.



Congratulations to *Madama Butterfly*, who is currently leading the Twilight Series by some 16 points. They've had a consistent year, typically finishing in the top five. Whilst we are only halfway through the season it will be quite the challenge for *Sirius*, *Solace* and *Far N Away* to catch this pocket rocket. *Madama Butterfly* has a long history at Manly Yacht Club and it's great to see the yacht being sailed so well.

This year, the Club Championships have combined into one division. So far this is looking like a great move, there are only five points between series leader *Ratty Tooey* and 5th place *Kia Kaha*. This is one of the closest series we have seen in years.

Leading the overall point score of the Summer Series by half a point is Peter Bennell's *Misky* followed by *Okavango Delta*.


Summer Series, Club Championships, Marathons and Sydney Harbour Combined Clubs racing also took place.


Plans were approved by the Sailing Committee in August 1959 with the prototype hitting the water in September of the same year.

FROM THE DUTY ROSTER CO-ORDINATOR


The calendar is available, and the Roster is updated and ready to go for the 2023-2024 season. There are lots of available dates for twilight and Sunday slots.

A big day on the Harbour with the 3rd Annual Battle of the Sound Regatta hosted by Vaucluse Yacht Club.

In a solid Nor Easter Manly sent 8 boats in two divisions.

In the first race in the ILCA 6 Division Ian Saunders was leading after the first lap only to capsize and finish 6th. Phil Reid managed to cross the line in 3rd with Ali getting 12th, Seamus in 25th and me (Cameron Wall) in 15th.

In the ILCA 7 Division Iain Cameron finished 8th with David Walton in 13th, Geoff Reid in 16th.

The second race saw the Nor Easter kick in even more and in the ILCA 6 Division Phil backed up

his 3rd with a 4th, Ian in 8th, Seamus in 21st, Ali in 23rd and I (Cameron) sailed home.

The ILCA 7 Division had Iain Cameron in 10th, Geoff 13th and Dave Walton 15th.

Overall results saw Manly finish 3rd and Vaucluse take the 2023 title for their first win in the BOTS.

Next year will be hosted by Northbridge.

It was apparent from the get-go that we were racing the current - the wind almost insignificant. And though I had been warned about the currents and did my homework re the current flow and tides and consider myself a free-thinking Aussie Sheila sailor, able to accept the challenge of working out a good passage (usually!) I have to admit to being bamboozled at times. So, in hindsight I should have just followed the Americans!!

The courses were very short, so a good start was imperative and the mark rounding critical. Most of the boats at some point hit/wrapped/got carried past either the windward or leeward turning buoys or in our case the pin start mark!(there goes the imperative good start!).





The usual top boats managed to separate from the pack i.e. France, USA x 2, Canada and Japan. The B grade pack (which included us) had plenty of "argee bargee" and all of us at some point were seen to do a 3-point turn and jibing pirouette as sometimes it was impossible to tack against the current.

There was little room to make up ground after a mistake!



Probably our best moment was on the 2nd last leg of the last race - choosing to jibe (44 times-Fi... Lee and Dee were not impressed) inside 2 converging lines of boats making up from 10th to 4th only to find ourselves stuck treading water at the leeward turning mark with a sudden strong heading current. Could have finished 4th that race but only managed 6th.

It was funny though I felt like I was getting the hang of the weird conditions by the end of the regatta (ha ha) and am sure I wasn't the only skipper to feel that way!


Looking forward to Evie continuing her journey in 2024! But first ... a well-earned Christmas break.

Congratulations, Eli, well deserved!










MYC WOMEN'S CHALLENGE




