



The Sydney Harbour Regatta is a special event - 100's of keelboats racing across multiple divisions over multiple different course areas, throughout Sydney Harbour as well as offshore near Sydney Heads. It is sure to be an exciting weekend on the water!









The rain from the week looked like persisting for Friday, and certainly it did... but only until lunch time. The weather gods, knowing that Stephen Teudt would be acting RD, and knowing that it NEVER rains on a "Stephen twilight", put on a spectacularly sunny Friday afternoon. Perhaps too late for some of us fair-weather sailors (pointing at *San Toy* here)!

21 boats started in the main fleet with 10 starters in the female helm division utilising Course 2 for the race.

Arabella, helming *Stock Car*, was first over the line in Twilight race 11, but Jan on *Esprit*, placed *Stock Car* 2<sup>nd</sup> on handicap in the Twilight Female Helm Race 3.

Line honours in Twilight Race 11 - Stock Car, Pompadi and Hebe helmed by (an expecting soon) Brie, as a casual entry in the twilight female helm with a fourth on handicap.

On handicap results in the twilight female helm race 3 - Esprit, Stock Car and Sirius, helmed by Emma.

Fastest around the course was Jan on *Esprit*. Closest to the start - and you can't get any closer - nailing it on 0:00:00 - congratulations *Esprit*, a double win!

Thank you team *Phantom Menace* for your race committee duties AND still sailing - well done.

The leaders at this point in the series are *Pompadi* in the twilights and *Stock Car* in the female helm division, but there is still plenty of racing to contest the leader board.


The first Sunday race of the season turned out to be a cracker! Albeit down on numbers, race 7 of the club championships turned out to be competitive in both fleets. The sun was out, the Bureau forecasting anything between 10-15knots or 15 to 20knots, depending on the model or the written forecast (which was more accurate) and coming from the ENE, with possibly a little more NE within the race window.

RO Peter Bennell selected Course 1, and, with the race committee of Peter Walker, Graeme Gaggin and Bobby Summerfield, headed down to Hunter Bay to start the race. Absolut, Esprit, Khaleesi and San Toy in Division 1 and Ça Va, Kia Kaha and Stock Car in division 2 were ready to race!



The division 1 boats were in sight of each other for most of the racing, with San Toy proving that you don't need a spinnaker to keep up in a

downwind run. Khaleesi claimed fastest around the course, finishing first across the line, but her big handicap finished her off in 4<sup>th</sup> spot. Esprit was first on handicap followed by San Toy and Absolut.



Big boat *Ça Va* dominated division 2 but Kia Kaha held on tight, finishing only 2 minutes behind. On handicap, Ça Va took out the double with division 2 boats finishing on handicap in the same order as over the line.

With lasers racing in The Sound the Peter opted to finish the yacht fleet off Robbie R back in North Harbour.

Only 3 more Club Champs to go and the

RO Peter commented "Only 3 brave yachts participated, with strong S winds (15 to 22 knots) that backed often to ESE, varied with windspeed at times, rough swells through the Heads & threatening to rain.

Stock Car sailed well and was the only yacht to risk/fly a spinnaker for the long return run to Manly from Shark Island.

There were only 8 lasers in their 4P races. Very challenging conditions also for them."

Fastest around the course was *Absolut*, with *Stock Car* next and then *Ten Sixty*, but it's the handicap that counts in this series and *Stock Car* was positioned in first on corrected time, followed by *Absolut* and *Ten Sixty*. Well done to everyone who ventured out.

Bright sunshine and moderate north-easterly winds provided perfect sailing conditions and a fleet of all 7 boats started the 2025 Australia Day Regatta, the 189th Australia Day Regatta, the oldest continual sailing regatta in the world, having been conducted since 1837. (www.australiadayregatta.com).

Bruce and Pam Davis very kindly acted as sailing committee and starters onboard *Ready, Get Set!!!...* and Warwick, John, and Kerry supported them, laying the marks, taking photographs and providing safety on *Charlies Chariot*. Cory once again provided his professional radio coverage and onshore management.





The first race saw Clare and Jeremy in *Black Swan* slip away, ahead of Denis and Nola in *Woody* and Sophie and Magdalena sailing *Eli D*. They were followed closely by Michael and Joe in *Ralph Newman*, David and Ken in *Vin*, Rob and Jay sailing *Dolly Wallis* and Skye and Joel in *Alex Martin*. This is the order in which they finished, with only 30 seconds between first and second.

Following the first race Jay swapped places with Ros as crew in *Dolly Wallis*. The second race was very close, with *Black Swan* once again taking first place, *Eli D* second and *Woody* third, only 15 seconds behind. Then came *Dolly Wallis* and *Ralph Newman*, followed by *Vin* and *Alex Martin*.

So, going into the last race *Black Swan* was leading the point score and could only be beaten for first place overall if they came  $5^{th}$  or worse and if either *Woody* or *Eli D* won the race. 

Thank you to Janette for mentioning her early MJ sailing experiences, in the History article of the January issue.

The MJ was designed by Ralph Tobias and first launched at Manly 14-foot Sailing Club in 1959.

As part of a group of families who were introduced to the joys of sailing by the Graeme Cotton-led-revival of the MJ, at MYC, in the 80s. I'm pleased to report that, yet another generation of junior sailors are carrying on the tradition.





### A "NOD" TO 75 YEARS

Reprint of history articles published in 2013

### **MANLY YACHT CLUB HISTORY**

The following article is intended to become part Club History.

Note 1: Stuart's Boatshed was located at the northern end of the existing boating clubs on the eastern shore of Manly Cove. It was bought in 1955 by the Manly 14 Foot Sailing Club (which Became Manly Yacht Club in 1965).

Note 2: If anyone has any additional information which is relevant to this article, or indeed, if anyone has an interesting anecdote or any other facts relevant to the history of the club let me know. Keep it brief to start with in case I have it covered already.

#### **PREMISES**

The acquisition of Stuart's Boatshed as the headquarters for the Manly 14 Foot Sailing Club has been dealt with in the chapter named Genesis and, once it had been enlarged by club members, it provided very adequate accommodation.

The main Clubroom, for example, was bigger than the one in the old Baths building but it was old and ramshackle.



During the 1974 storm the clubhouse (Stuart's Boatshed) was badly damaged and in July 1974 at the AGM a call was made to all members, both junior and senior, for a \$10 donation to pay for repairs. Members could pay by monthly instalments of \$2.

At the same meeting a Working Bee was announced with participants being urged to BRING A HAMMER.

Bon Ogilvie, club secretary, requested financial help from the Premier and Treasurer of NSW, Sir Robert Askin. In a letter dated 2 January 1975 his department replied that the clubs request would not be considered under the Commonwealth's natural disaster assistance arrangements; however the club could apply to the Minister for Tourism and Recreation, the Hon. F.E. Stewart, for assistance. The letter, he received, dated 14 December 1974, was from the Prime minister, Mr Whitlam, stating that "it (the government) might look at the possibility of assisting with clubhouse reconstruction". No more was heard about this.

Notwithstanding the unrest at the club occasioned at the prospect of moving to the baths building a letter from the club dated 21 August 1975 and signed by President Mellows, was sent to Council. It suggested the following: —

- The Club be granted a lease on the old Manly Baths.
- The Club will be prepared, using volunteer labour from amongst its members, to undertake a considerable portion of the alterations to the old Manly Baths building, which will include the following
  - a) restoration of the exterior façade of the building to its original design as far as possible.
  - the conversion of the interior of the building to provide clubrooms, boat storage area ,etc.
  - the demolition of some of the structures damaged by the storm in 1974.

Manly Council responded by suggesting a meeting as soon as possible.

In fact several meetings took place and matters reached the point where President Mellows undertook a detailed background report complete with costings. He said he had not appreciated the enormity of the task he had undertaken. His report spelt out the two alternatives, either stay in the old Stuart's boatshed or transfer to the Manly Baths building. It concluded with the following words —

"THE CHOICE IS YOURS
The work of investigating the jobs to be carried out under each alternative has been done by MYC members who are skilled in structural design, project management, architecture and building.

However, as has so often been said about education, this decision is too important to be left to the professionals alone. Your labour and funds will go into either venture.

Only you, the members, can choose which of the alternatives you will support."

The decision was made in favour of the Baths Building and the old Stuart's boatshed was demolished by club members in accordance with the wishes of Council.

It is worth noting, however, that if Stuart's boatshed was still standing today it would be cherished as an important part of Manly's waterfront heritage.

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
